The box office opens two weeks before the opening night of each play. Our hours are: 5 pm to 7 pm on Monday through Friday, 10 am to noon on Saturdays, and 5 pm to 8 pm on play nights.

You can also reserve seats by phone (831-4435). Tickets must be picked up no later than 30 minutes before curtain time; however, we urge you to pick up your tickets as soon as possible after ordering. Group rates are available for groups of ten or more people.

If you need to exchange your ticket, we must receive your old ticket at least 48 hours before the performance time shown on the ticket; no exchange will be made until we receive your tickets. There is a mail-box by the front door of the Playhouse so you may drop them off at any time.

You may have noticed that many performances play to packed houses. If you are a season ticket holder but are unable to attend a particular play, please don't waste your tickets: do give them to a friend or neighbour, as we are unable to issue refunds.
