In 1850's New York City an heiress, an only child, lives a sheltered life with her father in fashionable Washington Square. The arrival of a handsome and ambitious suitor changes the dynamics of family life and relationships are altered forever. The authors created this play from the classic *Washington Square* written by Henry James in 1880, thirty years after the events portrayed in the novel. *The Heiress* was a hit in the 2006 Shaw Festival.

A famous actress presides over a household consumed by desperate love, thirst for success, and fear of failure. The wanton killing of a seagull becomes a metaphor for events that follow and a symbol for the stage struck Nina whose inner strength is the key to her survival.

### One Flew Over the Cuckoo's Nest

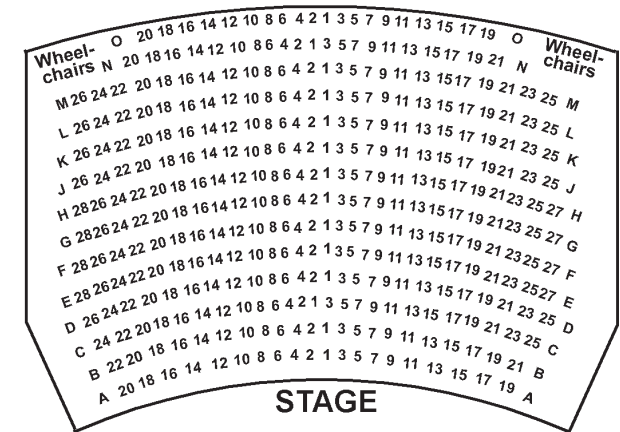
by Dale Wasserman from the novel by Ken Kesey

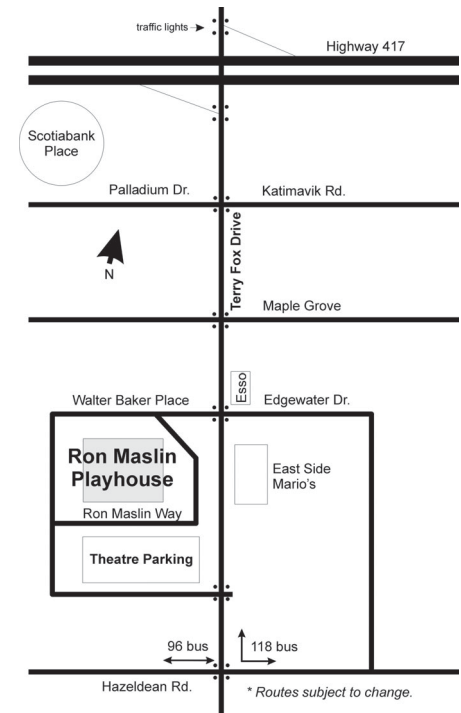
## The Ron Maslin Playhouse

## Ticket Policy

- Current subscribers are guaranteed renewal of their seats until **Saturday June 2nd, 2007**.
- Seats are then assigned on a "first come, first served" basis.
- We regret **we cannot offer refunds**; however,
  - Subscribers may exchange their tickets for another performance of the same play, **depending on seat availability**.
  - Exchanges must occur at least 48 hours before the performance date shown on the ticket.
  - Exchange requests will only be processed once the tickets to be exchanged are received in the Box Office.
  - There will be a \$1.00 administration fee for each ticket exchanged.

N.B. There is a mail box by the front entrance of the Playhouse for ticket drop-off at any time.
