### A Few Good Men

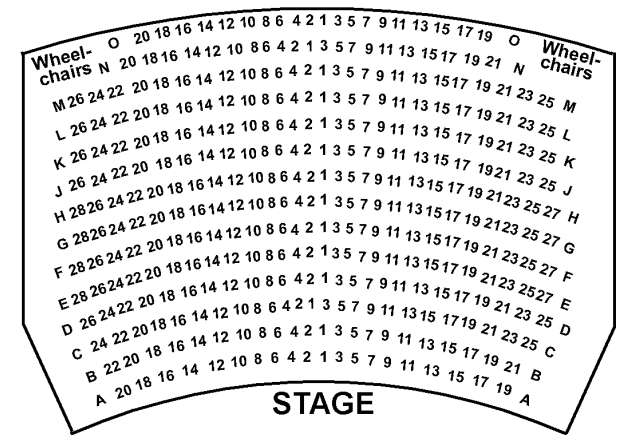

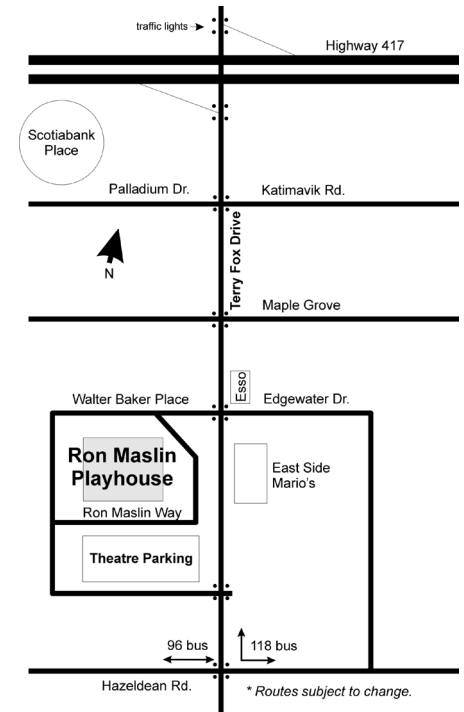
## The Ron Maslin Playhouse

  - There will be a \$1.00 administration fee for each ticket exchanged or replaced.
