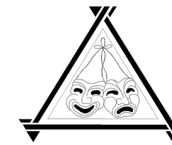

The next morning, their world collapses. *Shatter* explores the little-known details of the aftermath of the Halifax Explosion of 1917. A taut, exciting, and moving drama, it examines our strengths and weaknesses due to fear amidst the uncertainty of tomorrow.

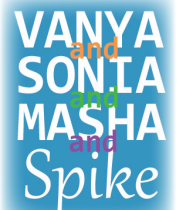
Arsenic and Old Lace by Joseph Kesselring

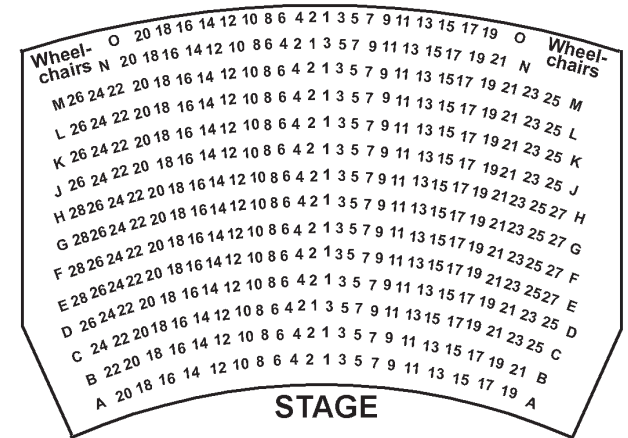
Vanya and Sonia and Masha and Spike by Christopher Durang
